"What is Masonry?"

"What is a Masonic lodge?"

"What do you do for the community or can do for me (Family)?"

I bet you have no direct answer or can only give a general non-conforming answer. To help you with this and more, we set out as a lodge to first set up a Lodge Mission Statement and to help you to better understand what you are in, where our lodge came from, what the Grand lodge of Wisconsin defines us as and the objective of being a Wisconsin Mason.

### First our Lodge History!

Some of this information came from our By-Law booklet

Chartered on 06/15/1859 by the Grand Lodge of Wisconsin, Rock River Lodge #108 F. & A.M., is a Masonic Lodge in Hustisford, Wisconsin. Rock River #108 is part of District #010.

The original charter of Neosho lodge 108 F. & A.M. was chartered on June 14, 1859, by MWGM Luther M. Tracy, with David W. Davis Sr., as WM, Nathan S. Conklin as SW, Samuel Hays as JW.

The building was first used as a store, then Modern Woodsman, it was bought and moved to 315 S, Schuyler St., Neosho Wi. 53059 in 1898. A fire destroyed the building in 1900, the brothers re-built it and then remodeled in 1959 to its present structure. Bro. & PM David B. Green was Grand Master of Masons for the state of Wisconsin in 1912 and later became Grand Lecturer for the Grand lodge of Wisconsin.

Two lodges Vesper #62 (Mayville) and Horicon #40 joined forces and became Horicon-Mayville Lodge #40. As time went on Horicon-Mayville lost members and joined Neosho Lodge 108 - on 5/27/1997 the three lodges became Neosho Lodge 108, On 9/7/1997 we changed the name to Neosho-Mayville-Horicon Lodge 108. We got a new charter recognizing us as Neosho-Mayville-Horicon Lodge 108 at this time.

Then in 2011 we got an offer from the church in Hustisford WI., that they wanted to Sell/ give to a nonprofit organization. Brothers Scott and Robert Scharnell brought the offer to the brethren of Lodge 108 in late 2011.

By early spring of 2012 we had acquired the building, Remodeled the church to its present condition to make it a Lodge Room and changed the entryway on the first floor. Almost immediately we started to do degree work in the new building. We have been busy with degrees and lodge events since the acquisition of this building.

We again petition Grand Lodge for a name change in 2018 to be Rock River Lodge 108, we were rechartered as Rock River Lodge 108 On June 7th, 2019, the Grand Lodge officers and the sitting MWGM brought us the new charter to our lodge for a visit in Sept 2019 and presented it to our WM Scott Scharnell at that time.

Personally, to some brothers, It was sad to leave Neosho and the old lodge building as it had its own character with many, many memories of great times. The Brothers really enjoyed the coziness of the old lodge and its uniqueness, but it was time to move on to a building that could support us and let us grow.

It has been a good move; we are doing degrees each year and we are getting involved in our community and the community recognizes us. When you do business in Hustisford and mention I'm from The Masonic Lodge they know about us. We never got that in Neosho businesses even though we donated to the School, Fire Department, Historical Building, and the Park. We never got any recognition in Neosho. That's sad to say, only the bank knew us because we banked there.

Moving on for us was a positive representation for Masons in a whole and the community which we now reside as Masons and members of the community.
